

Wine Glass Painting Tips & Tricks

Wine Glass Painting How-To's

- 1. We are using **ENAMEL** paints on glass, to give a glossy finished look
 - Enamel paints need heat-setting in your own oven to make them glossy and permanent. Instructions are below.
- 2. Wipe each glass thoroughly with an ALCOHOL SWAB.
- 3. Pour out SMALL AMOUNTS of paint onto your palette plate. A little goes a long way.
- 4. You can MIX COLORS (add white to lighten a color; add brown or black to darken a color).
 - To LIGHTEN a color, always pour the white out first, and mix a little of your deeper color into it.
 - To DARKEN a color, MIX A TINY AMOUNT OF BLACK OR BROWN into it.
- 5. **PAINT TWO COATS** of each color. Let the first coat DRY THOROUGHLY before you apply another.
 - You can use a hair dryer set on COOL to encourage drying a little faster
- 6. If you want a specific design, name, or initial, we can print it out for you.
 - TAPE THE PRINTOUT TO THE INSIDE OF THE GLASS to use as a template as you paint the outside.
- 7. DON'T PAINT the top ONE INCH of the glass, so your lips don't touch the paint when you drink out of it.

TO HEAT-SET YOUR ENAMEL PAINTS:

- A. IMPORTANT: WAIT 48 HOURS before baking.
- B. Place glassware on a cookie sheet in a COLD OVEN.
- C. Then, turn the oven on to 325 degrees.
- D. When the oven reaches 325 degrees, set a timer for 30 minutes.
- E. When the 30 minutes is up, turn off the oven and this is very important to avoid thermal shock:
 - LEAVE THE OVEN CLOSED until the oven and glasses are completely cool.
- F. When everything is cool, you can remove the painted glasses. REMEMBER: HANDWASH YOUR PAINTED GLASSES no dishwasher or microwave.
